A year or so ago we ventured to suggest that our agricultural societies might venture to take off a few dollars from the heavy premiums for race horses and devote some little to encouraging the growth of hay, but we have seen no movement in that direction yet. But it should be done. No better agricultural encouragement could be offered than premiums for good, clean hay, with well-authenticated affidavits as to the quantity yielded per acre. In the absence of any such encouragement our farmers would do well to turn their individual attention to it. to turn their individual attention to it.

What is wanted is some system by which pure grass can be raised—grass of rural labor, in a larger reliance for which pure grass can be raised-grass free from weeds and worthless trashand more than this, the nature and wants of the grass plant in various soils might be so studied as easily to bring up the crop to at least double that which the land now yields.

Even under the present slovenly system of grass-culture, as we have already said, it pays well and for the reasons given always will pay. We have now and then given some figures showing this, but there can scarcely be too much of such evidence. There are some very good ones in the last number of the report of the Department of Agriculture at Washington. A Bucks county, Pennsylvania, farmer reports the hay product of a farm of 95 acres is on an average of ten years, 42 tons per annum, and in market value \$1157. Last year he marketed hay to the amount of \$1204, besides keeping twenty-five to thirty horses and cattle. He has done what very few calculators do, charged his farm with interest on its value at \$150 per acre, as well as all labor and expenses, and found the farm yielded him a net profit of ten per cent. SUCCESS WITH SHEEP.

From the New York Tribune. There have been indications for some time and from various quarters, that The wool is going to advance in price. demand appears to be heavy in Eng-land, and this affects our own market. We have watched the sheep and wool business for twenty years during which time there were several panies, sheep being butchered for their pelts and tal-low; but immediately prices rose, and then every sheep was saved. Mean-while those who kept on steadily and sold at the going prices, have done well; while those who held wool over a year or so thereafter were well paid. The truth is, there is no better business year after year, than that of sheep husbandry, and for the reason that the increase of our population is so constant and great as to keep up a steady demand for all kinds of woolen fabrics. As it has been in the past, so is it quite certain to be in the future, and those who have sheep may safely get more. But let not inexperienced men rush in, for complete knowledge and constant attention are required. The best way to get a flock of sheep is to raise them, because there are but few chances to buy such sheep as will pay to keep, except at a high price. He who has good sheep knows it as well as anybody else, and, as a general thing, if he offers to sell sheep, they will be culls. 
