—A hen of thirty eight young legs, the property of Mr. J. W. Bogg, near Crampton, this county, and said to be the finest collection of poultry in the peninsula, has accounted to date just five hundred bushels of corn. The hens will now average 250 pounds each alive, and they are being watched with a great amount of interest by the farmers of that locality.

—Eggs are holding up the price pretty well and would be higher if the farmers would be more careful in sorting their eggs. When the dealer ships his eggs to the city, he knows that each egg will be "candied" and all bad eggs thrown out. This loss, together with those he culls out before shipping, cuts down his margin of profit many times so low it would take a very powerful glass to discover it. We believe if only fresh eggs were marketed that the price of hen fruit would materially rise.
