PENINSULA HORTICULTURISTS

Annual Session To Be Held in Salisbury Next Week.

The annual meeting of the Peninsula Horticultural Society will be held at Salisbury, Md., the 14th, 15th and 16th of this month. An excellent program has been arranged. In addition to the very practical talks that will be given by the fruit growers who have made marked success of their own business, the experiment station men of both Delaware and Maryland and the investigators of the United States Department of Agriculture will bring to the meetings the results of the most recent studies and experiments in different parts of the world.

Besides these noted horticulturists, noted fruit growers and educators will come from a distance to add their experiences to the interest of the occasion. Among these latter are Senator Henry M. Dunlap, of Saratog, Illinois, President of the Illinois Commercial Apple Growers Association, one of the largest and most successful commercial apple growers in the United States; Professor F. A. Waugh, of Amherst, Massachusetts, and Dr. H. W. Coltingwood, editor of the Rural New York.

Professor W. M. Scott, of the United States Department of Agriculture, has made a careful study of the cause and methods of control of the diseases of apple orchards, and will illustrate his work by a series of lantern slides. Professor Scott has also made a study of the brown rot of the peach, the disease that has played havoc with this crop in Delaware and Maryland for several years past. This piece of work is perhaps of greater practical importance than anything else that has been done for the benefit of fruit growing during the year, and the method of control that has been worked will be fully explained.

Predicted His Own Death. "I believe I am going to die before to night the lamp in the light house and see that it stays lighted." These were the words of Joseph B. Benson, keeper of the Bombay Hook light along the Delaware Bay, shortly before sunset Monday. When Mrs. Benson went out and lighted the big lamp to guide the mariners up and down the Delaware Bay and returned to the little house back of the government reservation, she found her husband's prophecy true—he was dead. Benson was stricken with a mild stroke of heart trouble on Friday afternoon, but he attended to the light as usual. He was 75 years old and had been keeper of the Bombay Hook light for 54 years. He had 12 children.

List of Delinquent Tax Payers OF QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY as of Jan. 1, 1908

UNDER and by virtue of Section 181 C, Chapter 235, of the Acts of Assembly, passed at the January Session, 1885, which read as follows: "On the first day of January in each year taxes shall be deemed in arrears and interest shall be charged and collected on all taxes, not then paid, from September 1st, the date when they became due and payable; and immediately after the first day of January the Treasurer shall cause to be published in an advertisement, in two newspapers printed in said county, a list of such delinquents, together with the amount of taxes due." Interest will be charged on each account from September 1st, 1907, to the date of payment, and an additional charge of fifty cents for each account to cover the cost of advertising. I hereby, in accordance with the above Section of said Act, publish the names of the delinquent tax payers in said county, as of January 1st, 1908, together with the amount due by each.
