"This is known as a tax-payer's return. Upon the basis of this return and an analysis of the information disclosed by the preliminary inquiry and the taxpayer's inventory, the proper amount of tax will be determined. Payment of the tax must be made to the Collector of internal revenue at the time of filing the return, but payment may be extended to a date not exceed ing seven months from the passage of the act upon the filing of a bond for payment This bond must be given with an approval corporate surety company in a penal sum of not less than double the amount of the tax and is no case less than \$1,000.
