The President's Liberty Day proclamation, issued yesterday, follows: BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. A proclamation.

The second Liberty Loan gives the people of the United States another opportunity to lend their funds to their government to sustain their country at war. The might of the United States is being mobilized and organized to strike a mortal blow at autocracy in defense of outraged American rights and of the cause of liberty. Billions of dollars are required to arm, feed and clothe the brave men who are giong forth to fight our country's battles and to assist the nations with whom we are making common cause against common foe. To subscribe to the Liberty Loan is to perform a service

Now, Therefore, I. Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States America do appoint Wednesday, the Twenty-fourth of October, as Liberty articles in every possible way.
