Shaw, Chairman in charge of the Labor and Employment Bureau. and 28 Commerce Street Baltimore The buttons and certificates of enroll ment will be furnished at a later date The volunteers will not be given im mediate employment both will be call ed on later The fact that so much shipbuilding is done in Maryland means that they will not have to go far from their homes


