One of the sections of the bill amending the oyster law provides that hereafter oystermen must fasten on their boats markers or tags, bearing the number of the tonger's license. the year of issue and the name of the county in which the tonger resides Another clause provides that for repeated violations of the Cull law, the guilty person's license may be revok-Still another provision makes the Cull law applicable to oystermen found anywhere in the State, whether affoat or ashore, and whether caught in Maryland or elsewhere.






