This we know definitely."

Secretary Daniels, of the Navy:

"Our men in the trenches and on the ships are counting their lives as nothing and are maintaining the highest standards of American manhood and hereism. It is our privilege at home to sacrifice and sacrifice and sacrifice to provide the Government with the means to carry on the war."

Secretary Lansing of the State Department:

"The United States has been at war for a year. The first enthusiasm which followed the declaration that we would take up arms in the cause of liberty and justice has passed, but in its place there has come to the nation a spirit of determination and self-sacrifice. Let there be the same patriotic response to the Third Liberty Loan that was made to those which preceded it."

Secretary McAdoo of the Treasury:

"The least duty we can perform and we should be eager and happy to perform it is to lend our money, every available dollar we have or can save to our Government in order that our gallant sons may be supplied with all they need to save America."

Attorney-General Gregory, Secretary of Agriculture Houston, Postmaster General Burleson, Secretary of Commerce Redfield and Secretary of Labor Wilson made remarks in the same tenor.
