In the next place, the income taxes which will be recommended to the House will be a codification of all limits: previous income tax levies remaining in effect. This is very important to the law, the payer in reality pays two income taxes. Both the normal and the surtaxes have been increased by the Ways and Means Committee, the increases being heaviest upon the larger incomes, of course And a new idea has been introduced in the matter of normal taxation in the past this has been uniform upon all taxable incomes. In the new bill the normal tax will be 5 per cent on all taxable. incomes up to \$4,000 and will be 10 per cent upon all such incomes above \$4,000

A NEW MEAT SUBSTITUTE

Boy Bean Curd Has Been Prepared for Use As Food.

Following experiments by the Department of Agriculture in the preparation of soy bean curd as a meat substitute, members of the National Canners' Association have received this letter from Dr. B. R. Hart, Chief of the Eastern District of the Bureau o Chemistry

"Dr Yamel Kin, who has been connected with the Department of Agriculture in the study of the soy bean and its properties, has been carrying on considerable work at the Laboratory of the Bureau of Chemistry, Department of Agriculture, 641 Washing ton Street, New York. This work has consisted of the preparation of soy bean curd in its various forms suitable for use as a meat substitute. Heretofore the soy bean has been used chiefly in the same manner as our common white bean and as a cereal substitute. The Department of Agriculture has instituted the present work in an effort to render available the high protein content of the soy bean as a partial substitute for meat in the dietary of the people of the United State." This matter is being brought to your attention because we feel that the soy bean dishes are well suited for canning, and to view of the present shortage of meat they can be added with advantage to the preparation you now have on the market."





Packers' Profits

Are Regulated The public should understand that the profits of the packers have been limited by the Food Administration

since November 1, 1917. For this purpose, the business of Swift & Company is now divided into three classes: Class I includes such products as beef, pork, mutton, oleomargarine and others that are essentially animal products. Profits are limited to 9 per cent of the capital employed in

class are not limited. Total profits for all departments together in 1918 will probably be between three and four per cent on an increased volume of sales.

The restrictions absolutely guarantee a reasonable relation between live stock prices and wholesale meat prices, because the packer's profit cannot possibly average more than a fraction of a cent per pound of product.

Since the profits on meat (Class 1) are running only about 2 cents on each dollar of sales, we have to depend on the profits from scep, glue, fertilizer (Class 2, also limited) and other departments, (Class 3) to obtain reasonable earnings on capital.


