500,000 TONS OF COAL WASTED IF HOMES ARE OVERHEATED.

The anthracite industry warns the householders not to waste a single pound of coal the coming winter. One great cause for wastage in the running of boilers and furnaces at high pres-When the house gets too warm. though, the windows are opened to permit the escape of this excessive beat. This easily results in the loss of at least half a ton of coal per family, or a wastage of at least 500,000 tone of anthracite during the late autumn and winter seasons. A temperature of 68 degrees is sufficient to keep the home pleasant and can be maintained with the proper weatherstripping of doors and windows with out the excessive use of fuel.

The production of anthrecite, this year, can hardly reach \$0,000,000 tons. Through economic plans, worked out by the industry; by facility of transportation, storage and pooling, it has been possible to gain a beadway beyoud what has been delivered of only


