

A procession was then formed to the Union Depot, from whence, accompanied by clergy and laity, the body was conveyed by special train to Emmittsburg and deposited in the vault situated in the cemetery of St. Joseph's Seminary. The ceremonies were of a most imposing and solemn character, and were graced by the presence of many dignitaries of the Church, including His Eminence Cardinal McCloskey. A large congregation was in attendance at the Cathedral and vast crowds lined the streets paying their respects to the dead prelate.
