A Reminiscence of Jackson's Presidency.

"It is stated that among the ladies who 'received' on New Year's day at Washington was the venerable Mrs. Eaton. This brings to mind the days of General Jackson's administration. The lady referred to was the daughter of a tavern-keeper in Washington named O'Neill, and was known by the popular name of Peggy. Her beauty attracted Purser Timberlake, of the Navy, who boarded with her father, and she married him when she was just halfway through her term. He soon afterwards was ordered to the Mediterranean, where he died. The young widow, who dropped the name of Peggy for that of Poly, soon became a toast and was a great favorite among the male guests who frequented the O'Neill hospitality. She was beautiful in person and fascinating in manner, and her conquests made her a target for the tongue of female gossip. Among the favorites she had in her train General John Eaton, a Senator from Tennessee, and an intimate personal and political friend of General Jackson. When he was castigated for his addresses to her, some of the courtly rumors reached his ear, but he disregarded them and married the beautiful Poly Timberlake just before he was made Secretary of War under Old Hickory." The wives of other members of the Cabinet refused to recognize her. This aroused the ire of the President, who had obtained a divorce from his wife after he married her, and had a sympathy for his friend Eaton. He vowed "by the eternal" that the wife of his Secretary of War must be admitted to society, at least to that controlled by the wives of Cabinet officers. These ladies were as stubborn as the President, particularly the wife of Samuel D. Ingraham, of Pennsylvania, then Secretary of the Treasury, who refused to invite Mrs. Eaton to her receptions. This petty warfare resulted in a dissolution of the first Cabinet of General Jackson. He stood by Mrs. Eaton, and she was admitted to the White House on the most intimate terms, often presiding at receptions and dinners, the President being a widower and in the habit of availing himself of the assistance of some lady friend on such occasions.

Soon after General Jackson's term expired Gen. Eaton died. His widow continued to live in Washington and became one of the leaders of fashion. About twenty years ago she married a dancing master, an Italian about the age of her dead grandchild. She lived with him only a few months when he ran away with one of her grand-daughters, having possessed himself of nearly all of the old lady's money and securities. Mrs. Eaton then removed to New York, where she lived for a number of years, part of the time in the most necessitous circumstances. She consented to a divorce from her Italian husband, who had escaped to Canada, so that he might marry her grand-daughter. This programme we believe was carried out and since then Mrs. Eaton has lived a life of seclusion. She must now be a very old lady, and her reappearance in Washington society must have recalled to many of the old residents the turbulent days of Gen. Jackson's administration."
