### PUBLIC GENERAL LAWS

PASSED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND At the January Session, 1878.

[CHAPTER 331.] APPROPRIATIONS FOR STATE GOVERNMENT. AN ACT

Making appropriations for the support of the State Government for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That for the expenditures in the support of the government for the fiscal year beginning with the first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, and ending with the thirtieth day of September, eighteen hundred and eighty, the following sums of money or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated, that it is so say:

**For State Officers.**  
For the salary of the Governor, four thousand five hundred dollars; for the salary of the Secretary of State, two thousand dollars; for the salary of the Comptroller of the Treasury, two thousand five hundred dollars; for the salary of the Chief Clerk to the Comptroller, eighteen hundred dollars; for the salaries of three assistant clerks to the Comptroller, twelve hundred dollars each—three thousand six hundred dollars; for the salary of the Treasurer, two thousand five hundred dollars; for the salary of the Chief Clerk to the Treasurer, eighteen hundred dollars; for the salary of the Assistant Clerk to the Treasurer, twelve hundred dollars; for the salary of the State Librarian, fifteen hundred dollars; for the salary of the Commissioner of the Land Office, fifteen hundred dollars; for the salary of the Clerk to the Commissioner of the Land Office, twelve hundred dollars.

**Judiciary.**  
For the salaries of the Chief Judges of the first seven Judicial Circuits, three thousand five hundred dollars each—twenty-four thousand five hundred dollars; for the salaries of fourteen Associate Judges of the first seven Judicial Circuits, two thousand eight hundred dollars each—thirty-nine thousand two hundred dollars; for the salaries of the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals from Baltimore city, the Chief Judge and four Associate Judges of Baltimore city, three thousand five hundred dollars each—twenty-one thousand dollars; for the salary of the Attorney-General, three thousand dollars; for commissions to Attorneys, two thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; to the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, nine hundred dollars, or so much thereof as the Clerk of the Court of Appeals may certify that he is entitled to receive; for the salary of the State Reporter, one thousand dollars; for the State's subscription to two hundred copies of volume fifty of the Maryland Reports, fourteen hundred dollars; for the paper on which said volume and volume forty-eight may be printed, in accordance with the Act of Assembly of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter four hundred and ten, seven hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

**Inspections.**  
For the Supervisor of the State Tobacco Warehouses and five Inspectors of Tobacco in Baltimore city, two thousand five hundred dollars each—fifteen thousand dollars; for insurance on State Tobacco Warehouses, one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as in the discretion of the Board of Public Works may be necessary; for the payment of the annual ground rent on Tobacco Warehouse lots in Baltimore city, four hundred and forty dollars and eleven cents; for the salaries of two Inspectors of Steam Boilers in the city of Baltimore, fifteen hundred dollars each—three thousand dollars; for the salaries of two Commissioners of Fisheries, fifteen hundred dollars each—three thousand dollars; and to defray the expenses of the Commission of Fisheries, as per chapter forty-seven of the Acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, ten thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary in the opinion of the Governor be necessary.

**Militia.**  
For the salary of the Adjutant-General of the State, two thousand dollars, to be paid out of the appropriation for the support of the Militia; for the Militia, to be expended under the supervision of the Governor in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Assembly of eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter one hundred and eighty-two, fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of pensions granted by various Acts and Resolutions of the General Assembly, forty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

**Contingent Funds.**  
To the Executive for the Contingent Fund placed at his disposal by Article three, section thirty-two, of the Constitution, seven thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; for the Contingent Fund of the Treasury Department, two thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the Contingent Fund of the Comptroller's Office, three thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; for the Contingent Fund of the State Library, two thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; for the expense of fuel and lights for Public Buildings and grounds, five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; for the printing of the annual report of the Comptroller, one thousand dollars; for printing expenses and clerical services, stationery and postage in the office of the Attorney-General, thirteen hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.
