AN ACT To authorize the Board of Managers of the Maryland House of Correction, to hire Convict labor to the Maryland Canal Company, and prescribe the manner of payment for the same by the said Canal Company.

Whereas, the early completion of a branch canal from the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to the city of Baltimore, is a matter of great and obvious importance to the pecuniary and material interests of this State, and of said city of Baltimore; and,

AN ACT To repeal the following Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, in relation to Pensions: The Act of eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter four hundred and seventy seven; the Act of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter three hundred and nine; the Acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapters three hundred and five, three hundred and fifty-one, and four hundred and fifteen, and the Act of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter three hua-

Secton I. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act of eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter four hundred and seventy-seven, entitled an act to repeal the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter three hundred and eighty-five, which provides for paying pensions to the Maryland soldiers of the War of eighteen hundred and twelve, and to the widows of deceased soldiers of that war; and also to repeal the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter four hundred and thirty-two, providing pensions for certain soldiers and widows of soldiers of the War of eighteen hundred and twelve, and to provide in lieu thereof for allowing pensions to certain soldiers, and widows of soldiers of the war of eighteen hundred and twelve; the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter three hundred and nine, entitled an act to authorize the Comptroller to audit and settle the claims of Catherine Middleton and Sarah Ann Johnson; the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter three hundred and five, entitled an act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of Ruth P.
