Improved Dweilings.

Within the last few years, many experiments have been made in house-building with a view of accommodating a large number of people in a limited space, at a low rent and under the best sanitary conzine. Several blocks of improved dwelling recently creeted in Brooklyn may be worthy of notice as showing the progress that has been since made in this direc-

tion. The seven blocks now occupied or being built are both single dwelling and tenements, and all are designed for families who can pay rents ranging from six dollars to eighteen dollars a month. 
