St. Petersburg is excited concerning the arrangement imputed to Count Schouvaloff, by which Turkey is allowed to occupy the Balkan passes.

There was a 100 yards foot race for \$500 and the championship of the United States, yesterday, near Philadelphia, between C. M. Davis, of Chicago, the Western champion, and F. Rogers, of Trenton, the Eastern champion.

At yesterday's session of the Berlin congress the Russian conditions for the regulation of the Balkan frontier were discussed.

Vanslyke, president of the First National Bank of Madison, Wisconsin, to recover tax on certain illicit whisky, on the ground of his being the owner and lessee of the distillery, has resulted in the defeat of the government, it having failed in any manner to connect Vanslyke with the distillery except as lessee.

Wesley A. Bishop has been committed at Norwich, Conn., on the charge of poisoning Chas. A. Cobb, Jr., who died suddenly June 6, and in whose stomach and liver arsenic has been found.

The wheat crop of Kentucky is being harvested very rapidly. The farmer reaps the grain as very fine, and the yield, which is nearly fifty per cent. over ordinary years, is from 80 to 40 bushels per acre.
