A. Hooten Blackstone was shot dead at Cumberland, Saturday, by Thomas Cook Hughey, during a dispute which had arisen between them.

A cheap fast train, crowded with people returning from summer resorts on the line of the London, Chatham and Dover railroad, was wrecked by a collision Saturday.

Advices from Japan are to the effect that the domestic loan put on the market by the Japanese government in May last for \$12,500,000 was fully subscribed...

Dennis Kearney arrived at Newark, N. J., Saturday evening, and put up at the Continental Hotel. He is the guest of the Greenback Club.

Wm. Madden and Peter Campbell, charged with murder of A. C. Compton in March last, were acquitted Saturday at Harrisburg, Pa.

Mr. S. D. Babcock, president of the New York Chamber of Commerce, has retired from business on an ample fortune.

The town of Maskolez, Hungary, was destroyed by a storm Friday night, and four hundred persons were killed.

A German government commission is coming to America to examine our system of taxing manufactured tobacco.

James F. McNeal's tannery, at Blair, Perry county, Pa., was burned Friday night. Loss \$12,000 to \$15,000.

Hon. J. G. Dickerson, LL. D., judge of the Supreme Court of Maine, died in Belfast, Me., yesterday, aged 65.

There is dissatisfaction over the postponement of the publication of the Paris exposition awards.

Andrew Lowrey, stabbed at a picnic affair, near Pottsville, Pa., last Monday, died on Saturday.

The whole of Herzegovina has been subjugated from the Neretva river to the town of Jlabjine.

Southern-bound passenger trains for New Orleans are not quarantined at Mobile.

The Serbian ministerial crisis has been settled, the old ministry being retained.

A daughter has been born to the Duchess of Edinburgh.

Austria's total loss in Bosnia does not exceed 1,900 men.

Orville Grant, the ex-President's brother, was taken in custody at Elizabeth, N. J., Tuesday night, on his arrival there from New York, and was sent yesterday morning to the insane asylum at Morris-town, N. J.

A Belfast, who was bitten by a spitz dog four months ago, died yesterday at Hattington, suburb of Philadelphia.

His death was marked by all the sympathy of his friends.

Mr. John B. Webster, the father of Capt. Jas. F. Webster, chief of police of Alexandria, Va., died yesterday, of paralysis. Mr. Webster was 82 years of age...

Bishop McNierny, of Albany, N. Y., gave a reception to Cardinal McCloskey in that city last evening, at the episcopal residence.

Ex-Gov. Henry H. Haight died in San Francisco, Cal., yesterday, at the office of his physician, where he had gone for medical assistance in a case of sudden illness.

The provincials are still fighting resolutely against both Turkish and Austrian domination.

Germany had a holiday yesterday over the anniversary of the battle of Sedan.

The socialists in Paris are dissolved now and then by the police.

WEDNESDAY

United States District Attorney Woodruff, of New York, has received a letter from Washington saying that the case of Michael Tobin, the West Point soldier under sentence of death for the murder of a comrade named Sayers, will be carefully considered with a view to pardon or a commutation of the sentence...

The charges against Gov. Axtell, of New Mexico, have resulted in his suspension from that office and the appointment in his place of Gen. Lew. Wallace, of Indiana.

The House of Bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church, which has been in session in New York, adjourned sine die yesterday, after deposing Bishop McCoskrey, of Michigan, from the ministry.

Although Secretary McCrary is satisfied of the success of the republican party in the approaching fall election in Iowa, he will leave Washington next week to take part in the canvass in that State.

Impressive funeral services took place at the Cathedral of Notre Dame, in Paris, yesterday, in celebration of the anniversary of the death of M. Thiers.

Hon. Hiestor Clymer was yesterday unanimously re-nominated for Congress, for a fourth term, by the democratic county convention at Reading, Pa.

The excursion steamer Princess Alice was run down in the Thames yesterday, and between 400 and 500 persons are reported drowned.

It is stated that Commander Cameron will soon begin to survey the proposed railway route through Asia Minor to the Persian Gulf.

One hundred and twenty-four natives of the Canary Islands have arrived at Havana from Venezuela in search of employment.

The new five per cent. Russian loan for 300,000,000 roubles has proved a partial failure.

The yellow fever is very fatal in Vera Cruz.
