The horse that is about to be driven on a journey needs hardening by exercise -preparing by sweating out the body to any part of the country.

As is well known throughout the Souther purify and increase the circulation of the blood, and glso by hand-rubbing the legs ration in some degree corresponding with that attained by a horse that is daily driven on the road for ordinary work. For one week previous to the start they need daily exercise, commencing with eight or ten miles, and gradually increasing to latest twenty per day. This exercise, with appropriate food, will harden their muscles, strengthen their limbs and prepare them to perform their tasks without giving out on the road, materially declining in flesh, or seriously exhausting their physical powers.
