CHAPTER 191. AN ACT Prohibiting the Sale of Spiritums or Fermented Liquors in the several counties of the State, on the day of Election.

Section 1. Le it enveled by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, store, drinking establishment or other place where liquors are sold, or for any person or persons, directly or indirectly, to sell, Barter, give or dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, or intoxicating drinks of any kind, on the day of election hereafter to be held in the several counties of the State.
