Great Prices for Pearls in London.

One of the finest collections of pearls that have been submitted to auction for many years was brought under the hammer recently at Chester House, Wimbledon. The sale took place by order of the executors of Miss K. S. Forbes, who for many years resided in London, and who made claim to being a lineal descendant of King James II. The result of the first day's sale was £15,815, and it is stated that many of the articles submitted to the public were found in the coach-house after the decease of Miss Forbes. These articles were of great value, and included watches, pearls, snuffboxes and canes of great historic interest. As an instance of this, it is worthy of note that one Bond street tradesman laid out on two lots £100, giving a bargain for some pearls on silk and £5,000 for a pearl necklace. Two gold enamelled snuffboxes from the collection of George IV fetched respectively £12 and 25 guineas, a bracelet of pearls, three drop pearls, £500; a diamond necklace, £1,700; four emeralds, £220, etc.—Pall Mall Gazette.

Another Side of the Question.

Mothers with sons are asking why it is so hard to find them places in business or office. Those who object to women holding positions of honor and respect are considered as belonging solely to men are quite glad of the chance to reply: "Why? Simply because the men are being crowded out by women, and the women are willing to work for less. The troubles are only just begun; wait a few years and then you will see not only how hard it is for your sons to get work, but how hard it is for your daughters to get husbands, for men will be more and more unwilling to marry when the chances for getting a good living are so poor." An Electrical Fog Bell.

At the port of Havana, on the Adriatic sea, there has recently been placed a new form of fog bell, operated by electricity. It is situated at the end of the mole leading into the harbor and the current is conveyed to it from a battery in the lighthouse about three quarters of a mile distant. The apparatus for striking the bell consists of a magnet electrically connected with a mechanical puller. The current from the battery causes a disc having pins projecting from its border to revolve, which pulls the magnet and makes the hammer strike the rim of the bell at regular intervals.
A telephone circuit enables the attendant at the lighthouse to know whether the motor and thus know whether it is working at its proper speed.—Philadelphia Record.
