How Farmers are Affected by the Tariff. Representative Hatch, from the committee on agriculture, Friday, submitted to the House a report prepared by the committee on the effect of the present tariff law upon agriculture, which will doubtless sound the keynote in the Democratic national campaign.

The result of the prohibitive tariff has been a steady decline in the prices of farm property and products under the several tariffs in force since the war, while for a corresponding period and under the same laws other interests have been more precious and remunerative.

The opinion of a government official is quoted to the effect that the census of 1892 will show that manufacturing interests have increased more than 60 per cent. in capital and production during the past decade, although the volume of crops has very largely increased, the report says the value of produce has stripped the business of all profit.
