Precautions That Should Be Taken. The world was never so small as it is today. Means of rapid transit are bringing all quarters of the globe closer and closer together. It should be the duty of the authorities to prepare beforehand for thorough inspection of all arriving vessels and for complete disinfection of all suspected freight and baggage.

The usually easy going American should not allow his good nature to modify the stringency of his maritime sanitary regulations. European officials are not commended for their increasing vigilance in this respect, for it is by their efforts that the disease may be kept from shipping ports, whence it might be distributed by commerce.—Youth's Companion.

Black Bass Briefs.

If you are angling for black bass with flies, and wish the flies to sink a little, be careful not to get any mosquito repellent on the leaders. The oil in the insect mixture will make them float like to much cork. This reminds me: It is generally stated that there are two styles of fly fishing for black bass. There are three: the first two—with ordinary sized flies sink a few inches under the water, as in salmon fishing, and the general method of using flies of a size between the ordinary black bass fly and the medium sized brook trout fly, which are fished as in brook trout fishing; the third—with ordinary black bass flies with a No. 2 split shot three inches above the dropper, and the flies sink almost as deep as bait would be allowed to sink. Of course this is a rather coarse method compared with other styles of fly fishing, but in the water where it is practiced—the Saginaw river at Bay City, Mich.—there is under many conditions really nothing viler about it. The water is deep, muddy and heavily colored by the pine bark from the innumerable log rafts that go up and down the course. I have seen half a dozen boats scoured with the sinker fly in a half hour's time.—Angler's Journal.
