FIFTY-THIRD CONGRESS. Democrats Assured of a Good Majority Over All Opposition.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—A compilation of the election returns for Congressmen received today from reports published in the morning papers and from later telegrams received to noon today give the Democrats a majority over the Republicans in the next House of 77 and over both Republicans and Third Parties of 69, with eleven districts put in the doubtful column. The returns as yet, of course, are very incomplete, and changes will have to be made in the figures on each side, as the later reports will probably show the defeat of a number of Congressmen now said to be elected and vice versa. The figures, however, clearly indicate that the next House of Representatives will be Democratic by a good large majority, which will be somewhat finally found to be some where from sixty to eighty. According to the present compilation there will be 307 Democrats, 130 Republicans and eight Third Parties in the next House with eleven additions yet to be made to complete the quota of 356 members. There were in the last House 235 Democrats, 88 Republicans and 9 Independent, or 332 members in all. The result is a relative gain for the Republicans as compared with the tremendous landslide of two years ago, so that the Republicans will have more than two aisles in the national legislative chamber for their members. But though the Democrats have lost a number of members as compared with the present House, their majority is certainly large enough for all practical purposes. The strength of the Independents will be pretty nearly the same in the next House, which will mean that they will miss the presence of their two most aggressive representatives, Tom Watson of Georgia, and Jerry Simpson, of Kansas, and the Independent of Kansas, will be the leading Third Party man in the next House. It is too early to make any calculations as to the effect of the new House, but it will be a very slender thread, if indeed it is not snuffed in twin by a combination of Democrats and Third parties.
