Parchment used for banjos, etc., is made from the skins of asses, calves or wolves, those of wolves being considered the best.

The Orthodox Mince Pie. The consumption of currants for pastry making purposes in the United States is very large, and the fondness for pies and puddings, into the composition of which raisins and currants largely enter, is un; questionably derived from the mother country. Our American kinsmen's mode of making mince pies differs, however, considerably from our own. From one kind of mince pie they use as a basis a fresh ox tongue, which for two days is kept covered in equal quantities of salt, brown sugar and powder I cloves; then it is boiled and minced very fine; three pounds of currants, picked, washed and dried, go to the entire ongue, with the grated rind of five lemons, and an ounce of bitter almonds and a pound of sweet almonds pounded, four nutmegs, cloves and mace. To this are added three pounds of beef suct, chopped six pounds of Sultana raisins and six ap ples that have been pared and cored. Nonabstainers add a quart of Madeira and s pint of brandy to the mixture. Miss Jane Strickland has another way

for making mince meat. She begins with finely shred and chopped beef suet, an equal quantity of cold roast beef; then her currants and her raisins and apples come in, and the whole is sweetened with moist Jamaica sugar, flavored with the peels of two lemons and the usual spices. This minced beef, when complete, Miss Strickland places in a tin dish lined with puff or family paste—whatever kind of paste that may be; cut slices of candied orange and citron peel are placed on the meat, which is covered in with paste and baked in a

quick oven.—London Telegraph. Natural Saloons. The authorities of the National Botanical gardens at Washington, as well as

those at Kew gardens, London, are at the present time experimenting with both the 'vegetable beer saloon" and what some one has been pleased to call "nature's own whisky shop." The main point of difference between these two antiprohibition plants seem to lie in the strength of the intoxicants which they distill, that caught in the liquor receptacle of the latter being much the stronger. Each leaf of the "whisky shop" plant is provided with a pitcher shaped vessel which terminates the end of the leaf itself, and each pitcher is provided with a lid which shuts down at nights and during bad weather, keeping the dews and rains from mixing with the beverage distilled therein.

This liquor, which is now under microscopical and chemical analysis, is known to be nature's provision for attracting insects, which the plant, after a true "spider and fly" fashion, entraps and devours. The receptacles of the "vegetable beer saloon" are larger than those on the plant just mentioned, and are without lids. The inside of the liquor cup is filled with hairlike spikes, all pointing downward. The unwary insect walks down to get his "dram," but the spikes prevent his egress and he never returns alive.—St. Louis Re

A Florida Girl on a Visit. This morning a white girl, about twelve years of age, suddenly made her appearance in the yard of the Florida Central and Peninsular railroad, and from her looks she had evidently come to Jacksonville as a passenger on the trucks of the morning train, as her clothing was covered with dust and greese. She would not give any satisfactory account of herself, and in a vory pert manner answered questions. She aid she came from nowhere and had no parents, and was going to see Lucy Wil iams at Fernandina. When closely questioned about herself she began to cry, and walked off to Bay street as independently as if she were Queen Victoria.-Jackson ville Metropolis.

Disinfecting the Sickroom. Pillows, comforters and like articles used in the sickroom should be thoroughly beaten on the roof, and exposed for many consecutive hours to the sunlight and fresh air before further use. The floors and ceilings of the occupied room should be washed with a watery solution of corrosive sublimate—one part of sublimate to a thousand parts of water. Papered walls should be wiped down with bread crusts, which thoroughly remove dust and germs without scattering them or injuring the paper.
