A Strange Indian Bird. In the forests of Bengal, a province of British India, there is found a little bird some what resembling a sparrow, which has reached such perfection in the construction of its nest that it is difficult to realize that it is entirely the work of this small member of the feathered tribe. In shape the nest resembles a "kooji" (Indian water-cooler). The neck or top, of the nest is long and narrow, but below this it bulges out into larger compartments. The usual number of these compartments is two, but as many as five have been found joined together by narrow tubes or "necks," and suspended from the branch of a tree. How Birds Are Slaughtered Every one who has lived in the country must have noticed and regretted the steady depopulation of our woods, thickets and forests of bird life. Even around homesteads, where one would suppos them most secure, the joyous morning and evening songs are rarely heard. In all parts of the world birds have been massacred for the adornment of the hats of women until the traffic has grown to

an enormous extent. Not only have certain birds been slaughtered for their bright plumage, but even the wings of all Linds of birds have been sought after by the hunters. Europe and North and South America have been ransacked for a supply. Brazil and the West Indies have been thronged with hunters and, finally, the traffic has extended to the East Indies. A writer states that London and Paris

are the two great marts for the supply of

magnitude of the trade. The Commissioner of Sinde (East Indies) said: "I have known 80,000 black partridges killed in certain provinces within but a few days to supply skins for the European market. Blue jays, golden orioles and hoopoes are bought up in any number at almost any price." Another writer said: "I have known a single bird catcher in the province of Lahore snare 200 kingfishers in the course of a month." One famous dealer in London has been known to receive in one single consignment 32,000 dead humming birds, 80,000 skins of different aquatic birds, and 800,000 pairs of wings of different small and brilliantly colored birds. A

Persian dealer advertised for a contract o supply 40,000 birds at one season. At one well known auction room in London not long since were sold 404,000 bird skins from the West Indies and Brazil, as well as 350,000 from the East ndies.
