Mr. Joseph Pierpoint died at Catonsville on Sunday morning of the effects of the grip, aged seventy-eight years. He was a truck farmer. Miss Frances Wright, of California,

died at St. Timothy's School, Catonsville, Monday morning, aged fifteen years. She had suffered for several weeks with heart trouble. Less sickness has occurred at Catons ville this winter than for 28 years.




