THE CLOSING HOURS OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION. The Smith Hill "Flood"—Delegate Wolfe in His Waspnet—The General Local Option Bill Knocked Out—Other Matters.

As the legislative session draws to a close both houses are getting down strictly to the business of passing bills at railroad speed. This session, in regard to general measures, has been one of masterly inactivity. Not many bills of general bearing have been considered. The fate of the assessment bill is well known. One measure, of State-wide importance, the Smith (free school-book bill), did get through both houses. The Governor has sent a message to the Senate, pointing out the measure's glaring faults, and asking its amendment so that, if signed by him, it might be operative.

As the Senate will very likely not comply with the Governor's request, it is assumed that His Excellency's remaining course is to veto the obnoxious measure. This the Governor will doubtless do. Telegrams and letters from school men all over the State have been pouring in upon him urging him to this course.

While there has not been much general legislation this session, there has been much local legislation demanding attention, and the Howard county delegation has done good work in this connection. The local measures which have been passed are of a nature which are of great benefit to the people of the county.

The sensation in the House of Delegates Thursday afternoon was a tilt between Delegate Wolfe, of Howard county, and Speaker J. H. Preston, in which Mr. Wolfe was the victor.
