The cow's nose is about a quarter of an inch thick, and is made of bone covered with skin. Its teeth are used for eating corn. They are each a-quarter of an inch long and a-quarter of an inch wide. The cow's front paws are made of skin and bone, and each has five nails. The hind legs are like the front ones, and have knots on the middle of them. Some cows are red, some white, some black, some yellow, and some pink. Cows are very scarce—that is, ours are—but I don't know about other people's. They are milked every night and morning, and we get a bucket half full of milk from them."—A. T. B.
 Maryland Biscuit.
 Add one teaspoonful of salt to one quart of sifted flour. Then rub two tablespoonsful of lard thoroughly into it with the hands. Mix with one cup of cold water to a very stiff dough, adding the water gradually, while stirring, and kneading all the while. Knead for ten minutes, and then beat with a biscuit-beater for twenty minutes. Form into small, round biscuits, pulling off the pieces of dough suddenly and quickly pinching them into shape. Do not place them close together in the pan, as each biscuit must be distinct. Prick lightly with a fork, and bake twenty minutes in a quick oven. When done, the tops and bottoms should be a delicate brown.
