INCREASE OF WILD ANIMALS IN VERMONT.

From the Boston Journal we derive the following: A farmer living five miles from Rutland entered complaint last week that a herd of deer had destroyed an acre and a half of buckwheat and devoured his vegetables.

What the result would be in a fair field and fair trial none can predict. Within two miles of Rutland the other day two deer were met trotting along the traveled road as docile as a house dog.

A reliable gentleman reports that a strange dog was making a deer last week on the mountains, near Rutland, and was lucky enough to keep out of range of a posse of enraged residents.

Another animal that has increased rapidly in Vermont is the porcupine. A party of people of Rutland one night recently occupied a deserted house in a lumberman's camp in Mount Tabor.

Deer are also very numerous, and often, with their young, take a hand in destroying fruit and vegetables, and are almost as tame as the porcupine.

The protection of the wild animals of Vermont has been the subject of much discussion in the State.

The increase of wild animals in Vermont is the result of the restrictive laws, for the forests are little hunted nowadays.
