"And why not?" asked the bewildered Governor.

You want me to lend it in Texas; at the same time you are trying to put Government in possession of a school of economists who promise to pay me back, not this gold dollar, but this," and her the capitalist produced a 50-cent piece. Governor Hogg saw the point and has been thinking about it ever since. The fact that he couldn't place his bonds has helped him to a clearer understanding of the relations existing between agriculture and prosperity.
