3. There is not a silver standard country in the world to-day that uses any other metal with silver.

4. There is not a silver standard country in the world to-day that has more than one-third of the circulation in paper that the United States has.

5. There is not a silver standard country in the world to-day where the laboring man receives fair pay for his day's work.

Here are five stubborn facts which none will venture to dispute, and no refinement of argument or theory can overthrow them.

Especially should the workmen of the nation study these five reasons given by Mr. Carlisle which present the whole case in a nutshell.

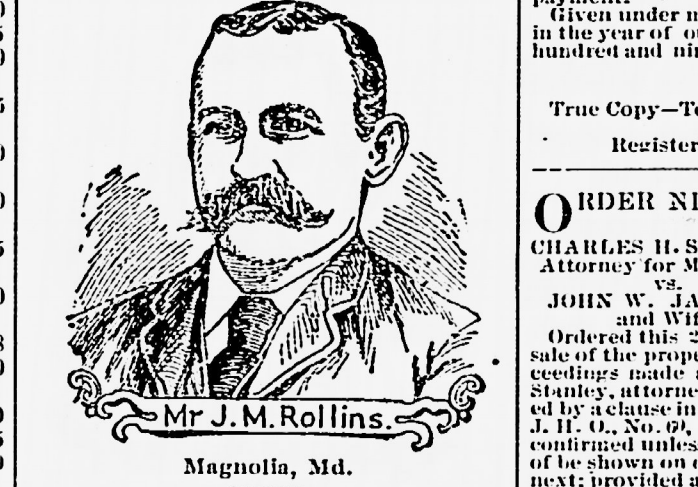
