Birds and the Farmer. Dr. C. Hart Merriam, chief of the division of ornithology of the Agricultural Department, has just made a report on the results of his examination of the contents of the stomachs of hawks, owls, crows, blackbirds, and other North American birds that are supposed to be the enemies of farmers. He shows that the popular notion that hawks and birds, for the slaughter of which many States gave bounties, are altogether erroneous. Ninety-five per cent of their food was found to be field mice, grasshoppers, crickets, etc., which were infinitely more injurious to farm crops than they. The charge against crows is that they eat corn and destroy eggs, poultry, and wild birds. Examination shows that they eat noxious insects and destructive animals, and that although 25 per cent of their food is corn, it is mostly waste corn picked up in the fall and winter. With regard to eggs, it was found that the shrike were eaten to a very limited extent for the time. Grass eat also ants, beetles, caterpillars, bugs, flies, grubs, etc., which do much damage. The cuckoo are also found to be very useful birds.—Rochester Herald.

The Sulky with One Wheel. It paced the mile in 1:38, but this, while a phenomenal performance, does not count in these calculations, for a team could not be used to the one-wheel sulky under any circumstances. If, as it is claimed, the one-wheel will be as much faster over the ordinary bicycle sulky as that invention was over the high-wheel type, a straight trotting, or pacing, record under two minutes may be expected. As it is C. L. Hamlin, with Fantasy, 2:01, and Monroe Salisbury, with Queen Alex, have promised to show miles better than 2:03 under present conditions.

The new sulky has a pneumatic-tire wheel, with a high seat resembling one ordinary bicycle seat in its mechanism. It is attached by solid steel rods to the shafts. The traces are short and the shafts are given no play at all, so the wheel will run smoothly and be easy to ride as an ordinary sulky. There is no danger of the hoofs striking the wheel, and it is claimed that the sulky helps the horse to keep an even and well-balanced gait. The axle has ball-bearings, like a bicycle.
