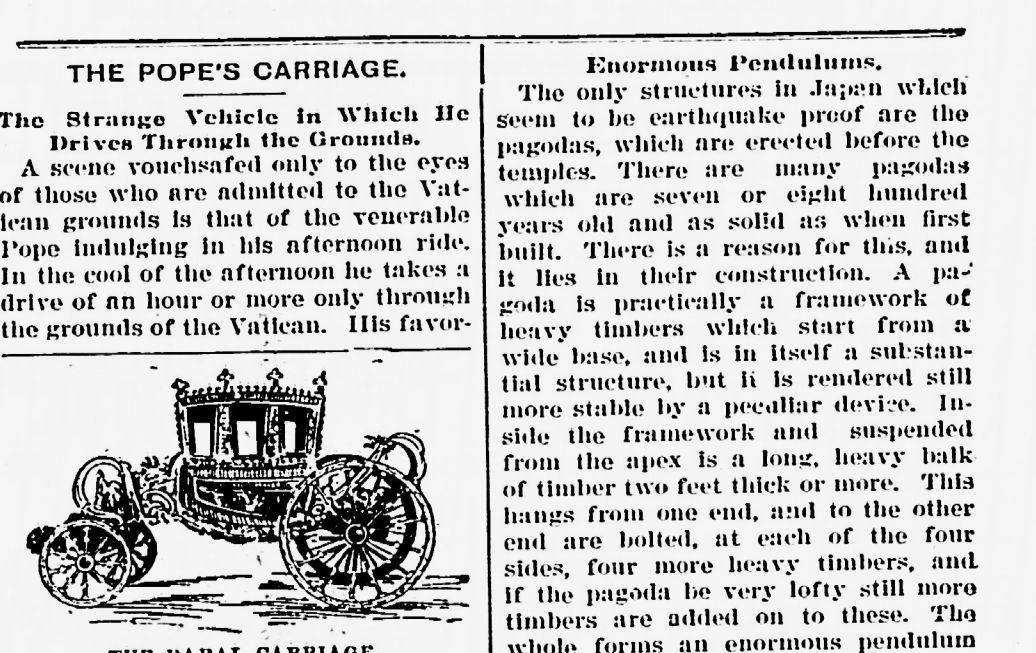
French Mustard—Shies an onion and cover with vinegar and let stand two or three days; pour off the vinegar and add one teaspoonful of pepper, one tablespoon of salt, one of brown sugar and one of thickened, let come to a boil and bottle.

EGG SYRUP—Make a white sauce with one-half pint of milk, a tunc of butter, salt, and flour to thicken. Take three hard-boiled eggs, remove the shells and cut them up when the sauce is cooked. Stir in the eggs and serve. This sauce is delicious with boiled fish.

French Honey—One pound of sugar, put into a pan with six eggs and the beaten whites and add the juice of four lemons; grate the rinds of two add one-quarter pound butter. Stir all together over the fire until as thick as honey. Seal it up and you can keep it as long as six months.
