Struck on the Head With an Axe.

Washington Towles and John Briscoe, both colored, became involved in a quarrel Tuesday. A fight resulted, during which the latter was probably fatally injured. Towles and his wife, it seems, were engaged in a fight at their home, when Briscoe who was a visitor, undertook to quiet the disturbance. This had the effect of increasing the husband's rage, and he seized an axe and dealt Briscoe a blow on the head with the blade, almost splitting the skull. Briscoe was taken to the hospital, where he died.

Seeking Indian Relics.

A party of gentlemen interested in the study of Indian relics went out to Woodstock, Howard county, last week to make an examination of a remarkable cave, known as the "Indian Rock Cave," on the farm of Mr. Ed. A. Benzinger. In the party were Col. Wm. Henry Love, Edwin Stabler, Jr., Walter Stewart and Mr. Benzinger, who acted as guide and host. A thorough exploration of the cave was made, and a number of interesting relics were discovered. The cave is situated in the base of a hill, and is about fifty feet above the Patapsco river. The opening in the rock is about fifteen feet wide and twelve feet high, and is reached by a narrow passage on the right leads to a second chamber. There are legendary stories concerning the cave as having been occupied by the Indians.

MURDERER PRICE LYNCHED.

Summary Taken from Jail by Masked Men and Hung by Tree. Probably no murder that has ever occurred in Maryland has excited so much interest as the murder of Miss Sallie Dean by Marshall Price. Everywhere there seemed an eagerness for the swift punishment of Price. This feeling kept at a white heat in Caroline county. Price has paid the penalty of his crime which has been visited on him in a summary manner. Tuesday night at 11 o'clock the condemned murderer was taken from the jail and hung to a tree.

THE JAIL.

The jail from which Price was taken is an insecure old structure in bad repair, and gave but little trouble to the mob when they sought admittance. The room in which the prisoner was confined was on the ground floor, with its entrance, which was guarded by a stout iron door, was guarded by a half dozen rusty iron bars which a strong man could pull out of place without much difficulty. After Price had been taken to Baltimore soon after he was convicted of murder he said that he could have gotten out of the jail in an hour if he had tried, but that he preferred to stay where he was, as he thought he was safer there than he would have been outside. The building stands back from the street about a hundred feet, and is surrounded by a wooden fence.

PRICE'S CRIME.

The crime for which Price was convicted and sentenced to be hanged was the murder of Miss Sallie E. Dean, the fourteen-year-old daughter of Jacob Dean, a farmer who lives in the village of Harmony, in Caroline county. On the morning of Tuesday, March 26, Sallie Dean started to walk to the school house on Monday last, and was struck by a large crowd who were gazing at the windows of Mabley & Carew, the large store in the town. He then dragged her by the hair along the side of the road and cut her throat from ear to ear.
