118 THE HORSE DOOMED? From all parts of the country comes the statement that the horse market is dreadfully depressed. There is doubt whether it will ever completely recover, ever in the sense of within a reasonable period. It has had a great deal of very hard luck. The financial depression made havoc with luxuries, and horses for most of us are luxuries; then

the introduction of the trolley systems threw tens of thousands of mild-mannered beasts out of steady employment, so that the depression in low-priced animals kept fully apace with the depression in high-stepping, arched-necked beauties. The new racing or pool laws are said to have affected the market for racers, and the bicycle has certainly had a disastrous effect upon the riding horses. It is no wonder, therefore, that horses are cheap. In a general way they have had, we take it, four principal fields of usefulness. As a means of human transportation, as draught horses, as farm animals, and as a source of pleasure to humanity. The first, with the abolition of the coach and the street car horses

has been practically closed; and the last

with invention of the bicycle, the silent

steed, the steed that eats not and never

takes fright, has been seriously and per manently narrowed. It may be that the horse, if we do no learn to eat him, will in time become nuisance, and with amazement our far distant descendants will look back a those crude times when their clever ancestors tamed the four-footed beast and taught him to draw or to bear them with ersoever they pleased! It is a fine thing to have tamed the horse as we have. A man who drives, even if his seat be only on a coal wagon, rides upon a chariot and proclaims, as did the conqueror of old, his supremacy over the beasts who draw him. But it is a finer thing to have tamed the power of steam; and he who throws open the throttle does a mighter thing than does the one who

urges his horse to "get up!"
And still nobler is control of the elec tric fluid, the feared and deadly lightning tamed for the uses of man, and so one who stands with hand upon the motor crank represents the highest achievement of all, the passing from ability to tame the wild horse of the plains, to control of a wild mysterious element of the storm and sky! We don't see that the horse stands much show against such a rival. ANCIENT GLASS.

The glass blowers of ancient Thebes are known to have been as proficient in that particular art as the most scientific craftsman of the same trade of the present day, after a lapse of forty centuries well acquainted with the art of staining glass, and are known to have produced that commodity in great profusion and perfection.

Rossellini gives an illustration of a piece of stained glass known to be 4,000 years old, which displayed artistic taste In this case the color is struck through the vitrified structure, and he mentions Cheaper Than Ever, and Guaranteed designs struck entirely in pieces from 1 inch to 7 inch thick, the color being perfeetly incorporated with the structure of the piece, and exactly the same on both the obverse and reverse sides.

adepts in the glassmaker's art, and not only did they have factories for manufacturing the common crystal variety, but they had learned the yitrifying of the different colors and the limitation the different colors and the imitating of precious stones to perfection. Their imitations of the amethyst and of the various other colored gems were so true to nature that even now, after they have lain in the desert sands from 2,000 to 4,000 years, it takes an expert to distinguish the genuine articles from the spurious. It has been shown that, besides being experts in glass making and glass coloring, they used the diamond in cutting and engraving glass. In the British Museum there is a beautiful piece of stained glass, with an engraved emblazoment of the monarch Thothmes III, who lived 3,400 years ago.

Rabbits in Australia,

Less than half a century ago there was not one rabbit in the whole of Australasia. A few were introduced into New Zealand in 1860, and into New South Wales and Victoria some eight or ten years previously, and now the multitude of them is so great that no one would attempt even to approximate their number. The hostility of man they practically defy. They march westward or northward, multiplying as they go and devouring as they go, and sheep and cattle and men leave plains and ridges to them. The central governments have contended against them with every weapon which promised success, and provincial bodies and energetic private individuals either supplemented these central governments, or carried on the war on ines of their own, but the rabbits are victorious today in a more effective manner than they were ten years ago.

The soil and climate of Australia are argely responsible for this. Under general conditions, rabbits will breed five or six times a year; on the plains of the creat interior of Australia they will reed eight times a year regularly, and nstances where this record was exceeded are chronicled. Beating in mind hat the litter seldom numbers fewer han eight, one can see what multitudes must arise if checks be not applied. The common estimate of offsprings from one nother in four years is given at over ,250,000, if that estimate had been formed on the exceptionally favorable conditions which Australia affords, the figures would be much more startling.— Chamber's Journal.



Tests of the Maxim Gun.

The light weight, rapid fire Maxim un, though not new, has been greatly mproved of late and in its present form It has never been Overcharged. was given a comprehensive series of tests at Sandy Hook on June 8. The gun weighs, packed in its case together with all its extra parts and mechanism, only 45 pounds, and is easily carried on a soldier's back. When in use it stands upon a tripod. The cartridge contains 28 grains of smokeless powder and a ball of 0.302 caliber, and a rate of from 600 to 770 shots a minute is claimed at 3,200 vards effective range. A range of only 500 yards was selected for the test. The gun was taken from a man's back, assembled and fired in 58 seconds. About 500 shots a minute were fired and no at tempt was made to greatly exceed this rate. In the breakdown test an essential part of the mechanism, supposed to have been broken by a shot, was taken out and replaced by a new one in 26 2-5 seconds. The barrel was changed in minute and 122-5 seconds.

Piercing a Nickel, We know that steel is much harder than nickel or silver, but a steel needle so very slender that it seems impor sible to force it through a coin. The feat, however, is very simple, and may be easily accomplished.
