Beautiful Home. I was absorbed in looking at the gracefully shaped chairs and couches, lovely carpets, the tapestry on the walls, and all the countless objects of interest which filled the spacious apartment when suddenly, without a moment's warning from either official or attendant the Empress, accompanied by her ladyin-waiting, approached. Her Majesty was attired in a well-fitting plain black dress, the material of which I could not quite determine, and a becoming garden hat of the same dark hue. I confess I should hardly have recognized our former Princess Royal from the portraits of her usually seen in London, for she looked so much younger than they represent her. No sooner did she begin to conyerse than I was struck by a certain likeness to the Prince of Wales, especially about the eyes when she smiled.

The Empress' manner is charming; one instantly feels at ease in her presence; and her keen appreciation and quick understanding of all that she hears are instantly apparent in the varying and sympathetic tones of her pleasant


