THE GAY MOSQUITO.

HOW THE SHARP BILLED LITTLE PESTS ARE BRED.

A Puddle an Inch Deep Is Sometimes Good Enough For Them-The Insect's Development From the Egg to the Compicts 3:ste-What They Are Made For An investing work on the mosquito is

'Dragon Files Versus Mosquitoes," a collection of essays edited by Dr. Robert II. Lamborn. It was the result of an investigation for methods of destroying the mos quito. The general conclusion of those who contribute to it is that the dragon fly, which is very ornamental, is also of the greatest value as a destroyer of mosquitoes Mosquitoes breed commonly in stagnant waters. Almost anything damp, however, will serve them. They have been foun in numbers in a puddle of water 8 inches square and 1 inch deep. They swarm in the holes made by hoofs in boggy pastures. Gutters and ditches in gardens are favorite places. They have even been known to breed in great number in the cellars of

Three or four weeks are required to per-

feet the change from the egg to the complete insect. The female carefully selects

place where there will be sufficient water to float them during that period. "Finding some floating shred of straw, stick or other support," says a naturalist, "the expectant mother rests her two fore legs on this, allows the next pair gently to touch the water and crosses the third pair behind to form a sort of vise in which to You would be astonished if hold the eggs as they are deposited. Then a long oval egg is lodged in the angle formed by the crossed legs, with its longer of CLOTHING we have sold diameter vertical; another following it is glued on to the side of the first in a similar position, and so on till some 200 or 300 are fastened in a sort of a raft, or rather lifeboat, as the mass is curved upward at each end. Then the little vessel is abandoned to the mercy of the winds and wavelets, and so floats about for a few days, benefiting by sun and air, till the growing embryos, finding their quarters too close, push open a kind of trapdoor in the floor of the

egg and take a dive at once into a watery home." The male mosquito, it appears, never goes into houses except by accident, and only drinks water. Blood sucking is an equired taste with the female. It has been calculated that there are 125 species of mosquitoes, and that 40 of them are indigenous to this country. A great many of the species, however, are hardly distinguishable one from another.

The mosquito has a cosmopolitan distribution. She is supposed to have her paradise in tropical countries, but she flour ishes in Labrador. She affects low lying positions, but lovers of the Adirondack mountains will recall visions of "smudges" and cheesecloth canopies on rustic bunks and battles with swarms of culicidae amid the soughing of pines and the sweet fragrance of the balsam. She loves the interior, and many a veteran may recall the days when he hunted prairie chickens on the plains of Illinois with mosquito net-

ting round his hat and face. The question has often been asked "What were mosquitoes made for?" If those who have specially studied the habits of the insects are correct, they certainly render important and useful service during their larval stage by cleansing swamp lands and stagnant peols from the miasms which plague mankind with various forms

of fever. The mosquito's brief period of larval life is divided between feeding upon micro orsurface for a breath of air. They reach their second stage by casting off the larval skin and becoming pupa-

In this stage they remain rolled up like a ball, and float at the surface of the water for the purpose of breathing through the two respiratory tubes on the top of their backs. If disturbed by an unwonted agitation of the water, they suddenly uncurl their bodies and whirl over and over from side to side. This Turn Verein existence, spent with no sustaining nutriment but atmospheric air, terminates in the course of a few days. Now the little water tumblers are ready for another transformation. The skin splits on the back between the breathing tubes and a little boat is thus formed, as gracefully curved at the bow and poop as the imperial barge of Cleopatra. Out of this fairy bark there suddenly issues a winged creature. The head, the body, the limbs, burst from the opening in the hard skin. The slender legs are raised on the edges of the empty bark until, spreading its wings and pluming itself for flights in sunlight and air, the insect rises, while by the reflex of its upward bound its tiny bark is overset and sinks

beneath the wave. There are two methods of limiting the number of mosquitoes, according to the naturalists. One is by draining all stagnant waters and the other is by cultivating certain species of dragon flies and splders which make it a business of killing the venomous flies. Their suppression would certainly add much to the happiness of this nation and to the value of large tracts of land.

Military Weapons. Let us fancy two soldiers in the mounted

service, equally brave, one thoroughly trained to handle the saber and the other an accomplished revolver shot. Station them 100 yards apart and let them advance toward each other at any gait, with hostile intent. Can any one for an instant expect but one result-the man with the saber would be destroyed before he could ar rive in striking distance of his enemy, armed with the revolver? Suppose instead of selecting two men we made the num ber 10, 20 or 1,000. Is there any reasonable ground to suppose the result would differ materially in illustrating the superiority of the revolver over the saber?

To exemplify this in another form. Let us suppose that a saber cut over the head or a thrust through the body is equal to a wound from a revolver bullet, and for the sake of argument we will allow the man with the saber to arrive within ten feet of his enemy with the revolver. We will assume that ten seconds are required for a "sabreur" to successfully carve one man and get within striking distance, about 31/2 or 4 feet, of another. We know that it is a very ordinary feat-for a good revolver shot, mounted, to fire five shots in five seconds and hit the size of a man every time, at a distance of ten feet, and this with his horse at a full run. The reverence with which we cling to arms ancient might well make a wise soldier laugh were its effects not so pernicious as sometimes to make a good soldier weep.—Major W. P. Hall, U. S. A., in North American Review.

Balloon Observations.

Observations from a captive balloon are more easily carried out at sea than on land, because the air currents are more uniform and are not so subject to sudden changes. Vessels can be distinguished perfectly, and there is no difficulty in recognizing whether they are merchantmen or men-of-war. Some recent experiments with these balloons result in the conclusion that at a height of 1,300 feet it is not possible to see the bottom of the sea to any great depth, in consequence of the impediments to vision offered by the color of the water and o the bottom.

With a favorable light, rocks and sand banks are clearly defined at depth of 19 to 23 feet. Larger sand banks can be seen, according to the color of the water, at a depth of 40 feet. In naval warfare captive balloons would be of great utility as observatories to a fleet, enabling the officers to reconnoiter the entrance of unknown haroors and for ascertaining the exact positio of forts, batteries and other defenses.




