



The Vestal Virgins and How They Were Monored by the Romans. It is possible for any Chinaman, or even any Chineso woman, to become a delty by paying for the honor. A few years ngo a rich and devout Chinese lady died in Soochoo. Her friends thought that an apotheosis was no more than, her due and apotheosis was no more than her due and communicated with the priests, who interviewed the gods on the subject and discovered that the God of the Left Little Too Nail had no wife. The old lady was accordingly married to his godship and is now enrolled as the "Goddess of the Left Little Toe Nail." The honor cost the old lady entate many \$5,000 lady's estate over \$5,000.

The principal wind deities were Boreas, the north wind; Zephyzus, the west; Auster, the south, and Eurus, the east wind. The first was remembered chiefly on account of a love scrape. He fell in love with a nymph, but could not speak softly and found himself unable to sigh at all. Knowing that it was impossible to make love without soft speech and sighs, he was about to give up lovemaking as a bad job and go back to his regular business of blowing, but took advice of an expert who recommended him to carry off the girl. He did so, she soon got used to his blowing, and they lived happily over after-

Vesta was the goddess of life and of home. Her altar stood on every hearthstone, her fire burned on the floor of every public building. Emigrants when leaving their country always carried with them fire from the public hearth. The Vestal virgins spent 30 years in service—ten in learning their duties, ten in practicing them, ten in teaching novices. After this term had expired they might, if they chose, leave the service of their divine mistress or marry, but few did so. Honors were showered upon them. They rode in chariots, a privilege in Rome accorded only to royalty. The best seats in the amphitheater were reserved for them. They pardoned or condemned the gladiators. If a criminal led to execution met a Vestal, he was instantly released, no mat-ter what his crime.—New York Adver-

RAPID WRITERS.

Gentlemen Who Covered Space at Good Speed Before There Were Newspapers. The rapidity of the ancient writers is seen from the great number of works prepared by them. Livy, for instance, wrote 142 books. Among the Romans, Cicero often wrote three or four important works in a single year. Of later writers, Dr. Johnson, Scott and Byron were all rapid writers. Byron, it is related, wrote "The Corsair" in ten days, while Scott wrote a work for which he was paid £1,000 in ten days. "Rab and His Friends," by Dr. John Brown, was written, it is said, at a singlo sitting.

The story is told that Dean Shipley once said to Heber, "Suppose you writen hymn for the service tomorrow morning," and by the next morning the hymn known all around the world, "From Greenland's Icy Mountains," was written, printed and used in that day's missionary service. Chalmers was once asked how long it took to prepare a sermon. He replied: That depends on how long you want it. If your sermon is to be half an hour

long, it will take you three days; if it is to be three-quarters of an hour, it will take two or perhaps one; but if you are going to preach an hour, then there is not much occasion to think a great deal about it. It may be done in an hour." Samuel Johnson would write at a single sitting the manuscript for 48 printed octavo pages. In one week he wrote "Ras-

selas" to pay for his mother's funeral, sent it off to the publishers without reading it over and was paid £100 for it.-Collector. Accurate Measurements. An illustration of the marvelous accuracy characterizing tools or instruments of measurement now employed as compared with those of former times is given by a writer in The American Machinist—namely, that whereas formerly .001 inch marked on a drawing would have been objected to on the ground that it was dif-ficult or impossible to work so closely to measures as that at the present time .0005 inch is measured in every fine workshop, and dimensions given in hundredths or

even thousandths of an inch frequently appear on drawings without objection on the part of the workmen. The instruments of measurement are now made with such a degree of refined accuracy that even the warmth of the hand may expand a rod 12 inches long so that the amount of expansion can be measured. It has thus become important in fine measurement to be careful that the temperature of the piece to be measured or gauged should have the same temperature as that of the instrument by which its size is determined. By first handling a rod of the length named and measuring it, particularly if the rod be of brass or copper, and then, after allowing the rod to cool, handling the gauge until the latter expands, it is found that a discrepancy of from .007 inch to .001 inch may be sometimes made apparent, due en-

tirely to differences of temperature. Pinching a Pickpocket. It happened on a race course in Russia.
