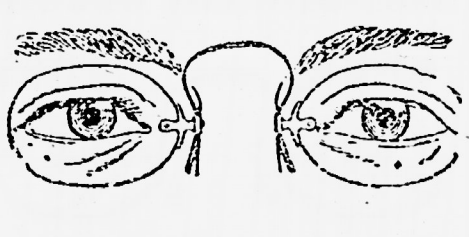

FELL CARESSING HER DEAD BABIES. Pathetic Incident of a Polar Bear Hunt In "I never look at a polar bear," said an officer from Fort Sheridan who was showing a party of friends through the zoo at Lincoln park the other day, "but I think of a bear that I met related to me by a friend in the navy, Lieutenant Byler. He was a member of an exploring expedition which went into the arctic regions several years ago. Members of the party who were more sportive than scientific in their inclinations spent a good deal of time hunting polar bears. Lieutenant Byler, who was with them, was naturally, but an experienced hunter and he took away all desire for that kind of sport, and he never went with them again. "The hunter came back one day lying on the ice with two cubs beside her. She was a magnificent specimen, nearly as large, I should judge from his description, as this one in the pit. At this point the men fired again, and she fell, but she did not die immediately, and in her last moments licked the body of one of the poor little cubs. An Unsuspected Cause of Suffering. A scientist gives an account of a man who was admitted to a hospital with a severe and obstinate case of inflammation of the eyes, face and neck. This proved the existence of thousands of tiny, round, oval in appearance those from the caterpillar. They had entered the skin and produced the inflammation. In the same connection it may be stated that experiments in the treatment of cancer have been tried with satisfactory results. An animal was injected with cancerous matter, then after a suitable period the serum of the blood was collected and two cancer patients were inoculated with it. In both cases the tumor almost immediately and positively improved. Sufficient time has not elapsed fully to test this discovery, but it certainly has great possibilities. It is to be hoped that it will only temporarily benefited there is encouragement enough to persevere until the longed for ultimatum is reached. - New York Ledger.

A Quaker Medal of Napoleon III. Napoleon the Great was a religious and moral collector as a matter of fact. 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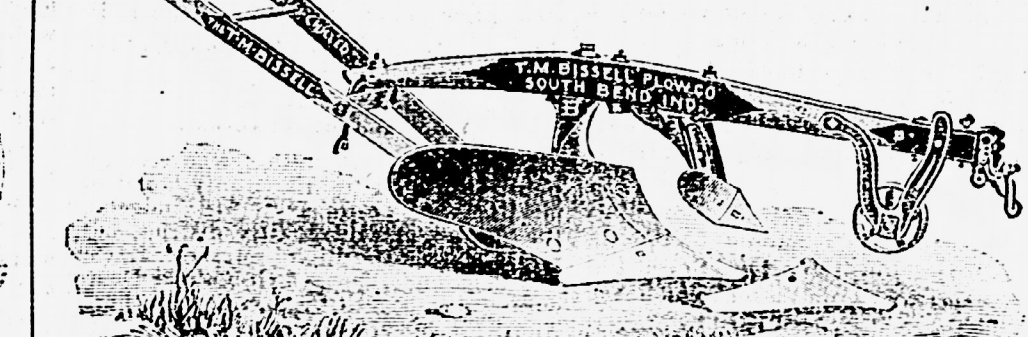
