

gifts is an awkward duty.-St. Louis Globe-Democrat. Peanut Flour. A well known doctor, who has experi-

mented with a number of diabetic flours in order to find suitable nourishment for diabetic patients, is satisfied in his own mind that peanuts prepared in the proper way furnish one of the most perfect flours for such patients. His method of preparing the flour is to put the peanut kernels with the inner coatings into a tin kettle with a perforated bottom. This kettle is uncovered, is fitted on or into a pan filled with boiling water, and the nuts are boiled for a half hour. This is done for the purpose of partially drawing out superfluous oil. The kernels are then thoroughly dried, and with a rolling pin pounded into fine particles. To prevent waste and scattering, it would be well to put the nuts into a linen bag until they are broken. The next thing to do is to put the bruised kernels in boiling water containing a little vinegar. When thoroughly boiled, the ker-nels are subjected to dry heat, but they must neither be browned nor roasted. When dry, powder with the rolling pin, and you will have a flour to be used in

porridge, with a little milk added, in biscuits and in German pancakes.—New York A Former Russian Statesman. 




