
The 'Shaker' has a broad and perfectly flat blade which enters the hill under the potatoes, and allows them to slide up on the blade and fall on the rods or fingers. The Rods and Fingers are hinged to the front end, and are free to play up and down. The Flange Wheel in the rear lifts and draps these fingers: this motion causes a continuous shaking of the potatoes, knocking off the dirt, which drops through between the roas, leaving the potatoes clean and free to roll off on top of the ground.
