SCIENTIFIC MISCELLANY, Telephone Journallism-Reversed Writing Science Watching the Baby-Oxygen a Probable Compound-The Up-to-Date Larnyx-Air Navigation by Kites-A Fireproof Tree-The Wind Measured by Its Whistle-Oxygen as a Poultice.

The telephone newspaper which has been in successful operation over two years at Budapest, has become almost inlispensable to its 0,000 subscribers. The service has a main wire of 168 miles which is connected to private houses and various public resorts. Between 7.30 in the morning and 9.30 in the evening 28 editions are spoken into the transmitter, ten men with loud, clear voices acting as speakers in shifts of two. The news is classified and given in accordance with a regular programme, so that any subscriber knows when to expect the kind of items of interest to him. A short summary of all important items is given at noon and again at night, and subscrib ers are entertained with music and lectures in the evening.

Mirror writing—that is, reversed writing which must be held before a mirror to be reat-is said to be cultivated by many persons for private correspondence by postal cards. It is not difficult to do, especially with the left hand, and left handed persons sometimes write in this way naturally. An English physician, Dr. C. Clapham, mentioned the case of partially paralyzed female, who taught herself to write with the left hand, and who wrote toward the left-or mirrorwise—at first, and afterward learned at school to write in the usual way. In moments of forgetfulness she would write one line toward the left and the next toward the right. A baby alarm, or means for signaling

the crying of an infant which has been left asleep in a distant room, is one of the recent boons offered by science. A sensitive microphone, connected to a battery and to the primary of an induction coil, is placed near the child's cot. The secondary of the coil is connected by two wires to a small electro-magnet at the place where the alarm is to be given, and on the crying of the child the mi-crophone sets up an indulatory current in this circuit, causing the electro-magnet to deflect a delicate steel balance and close an electric bell c'rcuit.

A reason for doubting that oxygen is an element has been given to the London Royal Society by Mr. E. C. C. Baly. Under the silent electric discharge, the gas that goes to the cathode with long sparks is less dense than unelectrified oxygen, while with short sparks it is more dense.

A very successful artificial larnyx for a man who had lost his voice is credited Prof. Anderson Stuart of the University of Sydney. The changing of certain reeds makes the voice soprano, tenor, contralto or bass at will.

The experiments of Lieut. B. Baden-Powell with military kites have been sufficiently encouraging to give interest to the curious suggestion in aerial navigation made by him to the British Association for the Advancement of Science. He pointed out that the wind is nearly always stronger at an elevation than near the earth, often blowing at 1000 yards with three times its velocity just above ground. He proposes to take advantage of this difference by connecting two kites by a long line and sending them up to different heights, the weight carried being attached to the line near the lower commodations for kite. The lower kite would thus supply a retarding medium to the upper, the PERMANENT & TRANSIERT GUESTS. ffect being the same in the upper kite were held to the earth by a string and the lower kite were towed through the air by a boy running with the string in his hand. Both kites would be kept flying although not held to the earth by the usual way, and it is quite possible that they might be navigated considerably out of the wind's course.

The Chaparro tree of the United States of Columbia is credited by Mr. Robert Thomson, in a report to the British Foreign Office, with a phenomenal endurance of fire. The tree-botanically known as Rhopsala oborata - grows to a height of 15 to 20 feet, and its distorted trunks measure from 9 to 12 inches in diameter. In Tolima where other trees are nearly all destroyed by the persistent burning of the savannahs and hills for renewing pasturage, the Chaparro not only resists the fire but seems acturally to seek it In the lower hills, reduced to sterilty by the incessant burnings, hundreds of square miles are covered by growth of these little trees, which are as regular in arrangement as in a carefully cultivated plantation. The resistance of the tree is due to the structure of the bark, of which the outer portion, to the depth of half an inch, is of peculiar composition and serves no vital function.

How it is possible to measure wind by its sound has been told by Prof. Car Barus to the National Academy of Sciences. The whistling of the wind across a wire varies with the velocity, and this can be computed from the pitcl of the note observed in case of a giver diameter of wire and for a given air temperature. A special micrometer attach ment can be made to convey the sound, isolated from other noises, to the observ er at a distance. Every gust and variation can be studied, and an idea of the direction of the gust can be had from ounds from three wires placed at right angles to one another. Micro-aulmomery is the name proposed for observa ions by this method.

Suppurating wounds, ulcers, lupous and tuberculous sores have been treated by Dr. G. Stoker with remarkable results y surrounding them with an atmosphere of pure oxygen, by means of rubber bags. Not only were old sores rapidly healed, but pain was almost immediately allevi-






