ON THE ROAD TO DAWSON
A Woman Klondiker's Experiences and Impressions.
SOME QUESTIONS OF COSTUME.

The Woman Who Crosses Chilkoot Leaves Pride and Dainty Apparel Behind—But She Has Lots of Fun For Her Trouble. Trials of the Trail.

[From Our Special Correspondent.]
SHEEP CAMP, March 23.

If we have as much fun getting to Dawson City as we have had in getting here, the trip will be satisfactory. The experience of being an apparent savage in the midst of civilization or a savage in the midst of apparent civilization, depending entirely upon the point of view, is in some ways as amusing as it is novel. As there is a bare possibility that I may return alive from this Klondike trip and may consequently need some of my ordinary attire I did not take anything with me to the Pacific coast except that which is suitable for Alaska travel. Unfortunately we had to wait several days in Seattle and Portland, and to say that the Klondike gear carried so long is discouragingly so. And yet my costume was merely a plain brown tweed bicycle suit, with cap and high laced boots big enough to admit of the two or three pairs of stockings that are supposed to be needed, according to all Klondike lore, in Dawson City. Then, as it always rains in the glorious winter climate of the Pacific coast, I had to wear rubbers.

Furthermore, my land master insisted that as we had only a few days at most to enjoy civilization we should go to the swell hotel of Portland. We arrived Sunday night just before dinner. When I hear the voices howl for the first time, I can feel no greater indignation than I did when I stepped from the elevator and ran the gauntlet as we walked through the office, past the sun parlor, with its palms and cushions, past the ornate dining room, past the smoking parlor, past the double row of ornate waiting chairs in the dining room, brilliant with electric light and gay with blossoming plants and elaborately dressed ladies.

I was reassured by being told that it would be only a day or two, we would sail shortly, but we had not calculated on the uncertainty of anything and everything pertaining to Alaska. When we had to wait for a steamer, it precipitated me to go to a smaller and quieter hotel. But we only exchanged the fire for the frying pan. The patrons were for the most part natives, exclusive and conservative, and looked at me askance. At the first meal a lady at the next table remarked:

"There is one good side to this Alaska craze. The people who go there are the unrelatable element it will be better for the country to be without."

Possibly the lady may have forgotten that she would be no Portland, Ore. had it not been for the same pioneer spirit that is pushing her to the frozen north today. As far as my own experience has gone, this "element," while composed of all classes from all parts of the world, is extremely courteous to the ladies and kind hearted and friendly to every one. So it is with the women who are on their way through. While at times one comes in contact with an individual who is an antithesis to the general rule, for the most part the women are modest and unassuming, entering into the novelty of the trip with zest that hides the serious purpose deep within. In fact, they are sometimes so jolly that they have been accused of being ignorant of the hardships they would have to undergo. One of these very women told me that if she should die on the way she would be satisfied knowing that she had been with her husband to the last, and if by any chance anything should happen to him her revolver would prevent the necessity of her going back home. And on it is with most of them, plenty of vivacity and lots of courage and real "grit."

Queer Outfits.
We have had much merriment over certain articles that we have had to purchase on our respective hardships with necessities and not luxuries. One woman with a party who is going to stay two years insisted upon a washboard, and after much argument the men compromised by allowing her to take the same washboard and promising to make the wooden part for her when settled. Another woman grieved because she did not have a dustpan. Her husband led out against a broom, but had to give in at last, compromising on a child's broom. Speaking of carrying of such things, one man has a feather bed and is scornfully superior to sleeping bags. It is very funny this going to market
