PROGRESS OF THE WAR.

The government and people experienced a profound sense of relief Thursday afternoon when it became known that Santiago had thrown up the sponge and yielded to unconditional surrender...

Naturally strong, Santiago presented almost insuperable difficulties to an attacking party and in many cases it took but slight resistance on the part of the Spaniards to resist attack.

Now that Santiago has fallen operations will be at once resumed. General Watson's squadron will be detached to bombard ports on the coast of Spain.

Admiral Dewey is conducting affairs at Manila with a master hand. Even after conquest the political and social problems will be difficult.

PORTO RICO NEXT AND THE PHILIPPINES IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

Yellow Jack More to be Dreaded Than The Enemy.

At 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon General Toral's command of Spanish troops in the city of Santiago, formally surrendered to Generals Miles and Shafter.

Early in the day General Toral sent a message asking for the appointment of peace commissioners to arrange his capitulation, and said that he was willing to agree to the American proposal.

Dispatches reporting the surrender to Washington were received by the President shortly after 3 P. M.

It is believed that the number of troops surrendered by General Toral will be about 12,000, though later reports increase this to 15,000.

The American army will not march in and take possession of Santiago until the yellow fever problem is solved.
