It is thereupen adjudged and ordered by the said court, that the said Samuel Smoot, by essuing a copy of this order to be inserted in one of the newspapers in the city of Paltimore, and ore in the town of Easton, three mouths before Saturday, the third day of November next, and to be continued in the said papers for six successive weeks; and allo, by setting up like notice at the court-house, three mouths before the said day—Give notice to his creditors to appear before the said county court at the court-house in the said county on the said day, for the purpose of racome mending a trustee for their benefit, and to answer interrogatories which his creditors may propose to him, the said Samuel Smoot, then and there complying with the requisits of the said acts of assombly.
