INVENTION.

Mr. J. Minor, an ingenious mechanic of Ballston, has obtained a patent for an improved water wheel, (his lavention) which is so constructed as to supercede the necessi y of a dam—the wheel is intended to be immersed in any stream or current of water, which runs with required rapidity, or in situations where it may receive the action, either of the flux or reflux of the tide; to be placed in a horizontal shaft—the floats extending in radii from the shaft, at right angles thereto, increasing in width from the bhaft to their extremities, with their flat surfaces inclined towards the line of the shaft; in this respect it resembles the sails of a wind-mill or the fly of the smoakjack, receiving motion from the water in the same manner those do from the current of air; the inclination of the floats to be according to the strength of the current - The i ventor has kept a provident eye on possible contingencies, and constructed his machinery to meet their effects.
