Bri uin, on her own terms, with articles Imperiou ly necessary to her existence, whilst she in re um refuses us the liberty of trading with nations with whom we are at peace. Implense exportations of British manufactures were expected to take place in the course of a few weeks to America, chicar of cotton goods, on which a day of about 50 per cent, on the first cost of the raw materi al has been paid by the Americans into the British treasury, and it now comes back, with a variety of taxes, and profits charged on it, and taxed with 15 per cent, duty on this side, in order to ruise ways and means for Air. Gallatin's finan ctol system, which is that of taking mo ney out of the people's fisckels without letting them know it. The faction which has subserved Great Bittain, and procured the abandonment of a pacific policy by the refeel of the embargo, are responsible for all the plunder which the legitimate commerce of the United States has sustained in consequencethe events which their perfidy have produced will nei her place them in power, nor array the American nation under the binner of George III in support of the oppression and descrition of our rights as a free nation; the continent of Europe closed against us, and our fleg, which we have suffered to be prostituted, until the national character is sunk, will no longer protect the fair any more than the foul commerce; we shall be embar-goed by bank upocy and the entaity of all nations, for our policy has been neither just to other nations nor to our [Sui ora.
