He was sensitly affected at the sight of the fine whole length portrait of his unfortunate broth er, Louis XVI. in one of the smaller state withdrawing rooms. His majesty afterwards inspected the farm yards, and implements o husbandry exhibiting for prizes, which were explained to him by lord Wentworth, and at which he ex pressed great satisfiction. Just before 3 he got into his, post coach, and returned to Aylesbury to dinner.
