This is again one of those wicked arti fices adopted by the machinations of the Port of Crimes to bewilder public opi After the calumnious imputation which we have noticed and des royed to our No 27, with which those shameful creatures streve to give a blow to our government, by throwing on it a ridicule of which they alone are incapable, we ought not to be astonished a that which their agents utter on the American con tment almost immediately af er the same impostures which they wished to give currercy to in England. Messra Lawis and Kast have greatly exerted themselves to cause to appear in foreign pa pers articles tending to destroy the confidence we have so justly acquired; they will not seften by this the hardness of heart of their detailers of news; a faiselined moreover shall not escape from the tulons of these merciless beasters, and the truth will be always more powerful (han their intrigues

What is the duty of the magistrate, if it is not to pronounce, in obedience to the laws of the country, the confiscation of a vessel which is found acting in contravention thereof?

Until that our perfictious enemies of the Petionic republic have artained to overturn the respects, considerations and implied conventions which governments owe to each other; until that they have conciliated with the interests of their passions the truths included in the four questions that I am about to establish, we think ourselves supported in the exercise of a right avowed by all the nations of Europe. The 42d article alone of our constitution which says, "By reason or the advantages which foreigners enjoy at Hayti hey me to submit, during their stay, to the laws and customs of the country, in like manner as the sub-jects of Hayti," closes the mouths of our adversaries, and legicimates this measure of rigour Why, has not captain George Northern transgressed the laws of our country, by supplying with provisions a place declared in a state of blockade by all the official publications emanating from our government, and particularly by the proclamation of the 16th of October, 1809, in entering by steelth a port which he saw blockaded by our vesseis? NEW-YORK, Aug. 22 LATEST FROM CADIZ.

By the ship Maria, captain Church we learn that the siege of Cadiz emained much the me for some weeks post : that the party of 5 or 6000 men that had been dispatched under the command of g.n. Lacey, to get possession of the Si erra of Rends, had returned to Cadiz without accomplishing its ultimate ch ject—which was by co-operating with the British expedition from Gibraitar, to retake Malaga.

Ga: eral Ferguson had arrived at Cediz from E gland and was to rank in the army second in command. We have not been able to learn any further particulars of the defeat of general Crawford in Porrugal, as no intelligence had been recrived at Cadiz f his having effected a junction with lord Wellington's army.

It was rumoured at Cadiz, that gen Massena had nisde a retrogade movement, not having a sufficient force to fare the combined British and Portuguese armics
