a The Emperor an lauded the gene ral embargo faid by the United S ates on all their vessels; because that neasure, if it has been prejudici I to France, con tained at least nothing offensive to he honor. It has caused her to lose her colonies of Guadeloupe, Martinque and Coyenne The empetor did not com plan of it. He made this sarifice to the principle which determined the Americans to impose the embargo, and which inspired hem with the rable resolution of inderdicting their selves the use of the sea, rather that subject to the laws of those who wish to overcome its

"The ret of the 1st of March ren.o ved the embargo, and substituted for it a measure which mus have been particularly injurious to the interests of France. That act, with which the emperor was not acquain od for a conside rable time after, inde sicted to American vessels the commerce of France, whilst it au horised a trade with Spain, Napies and Holland-tha: is to say, with coun tries under F ench influsive-and setries under F ench influence—and se-nomiced confiscation against all French vassels that should enter the ports of unknown Sept 12 1 t 23, lon 65, spoke right, and commanded by the dignity of 15th, let 3, 100 69 39, speke brig Charimpossible e i ke any compron isc The sequestration of all the American vessels in Flance was the accessary re sult of the measure taken by congress
